Narrative Summary of the Proposed Action

In 2019, Montana Department of Transportation (MDT) began construction on a new bridge and road realignment project at Toston, MT where HWY287 crosses the Missouri River. Approximately 4 acres of the NW corner of the FAS was ceded to MDT for the purposes of the project. At this time, FWP staff identified an opportunity to expand the parking area two acres utilizing the disturbed area that was used as staging for the project. At that time, it was agreed that the bridge construction contractor would contribute labor and equipment toward the total cost of the parking lot expansion prior to demobilization.

Description and Analysis of Reasonable Alternatives

- Alternative A: No Action**
 No action would result in a site that would remain highly impacted and subject wind erosion and weed infestation. Additionally, the public would not receive the benefit of increased parking capacity to accommodate increased demand.
- Alternative B: Proposed Action.**
 The proposed action would serve to reclaim the entire area impacted by the bridge construction and allow FWP to meet the additional parking needs of the recreating public.

#5- The area was heavily disturbed during the bridge construction project. As part of the original agreement, MDT agreed that the contractor would be responsible for reclaiming the entire area impacted by the construction project. Additionally, the contractor will be responsible for annual weed control treatments from 2021 – 2023.
