Job 1. Lake and Stream Somey. Incentory

The objectives are to determine the physical, chemical, and biological of impartance to the recreational fickery characteristics of lakes in the project area accessible to motor vehicles. Many of our lakes support natural gamefish populations, and others need periodic introductions where spawning facilities are limited or lacking. Most of these lakes have been surveyed at one time or another and some are presently receiving special management procedures. However, more information is needed on many lakes to manage them successfully. Lakes of importance to recreation will be surveyed every three to four years. Maps of these lakes will be obtained from various government agencies, aerial photographs, or constructed in the field. Thirteen lakes were surveyed last year in the management area. Seven lakes contained natural rainbow trout and brook trout populations and some of these had too many small brook trout which are undesirable as a sport fishery. The other lakes are currently or were put on the stocking program to receive trout introductions periodically. The important lakes in the Big Hole drainage will be surveyed this year along with others needing special attention in the District.

This is a continuing project.
