This booklet is designed to help you find and experience some quality fishing opportunities located in Southeastern Montana. Many small reservoirs are scattered throughout the region and have a variety of fish species. Please take the time to read this entire guide.

This guide consists of four main sections:

- General information regarding the Pond Program, fishing regulations, state records of warm water fish, public land agency contacts, and common fishing knots.
- A map of each county identifying the general location of each pond.
- A county specific table listing each pond and location, recent water conditions, fish stocking information and other general information.
- Pond specific maps to assist in locating a pond.

Every effort has been made to make the information in this booklet as accurate and up-to-date as possible. Despite our efforts, errors are possible and likely. Many ponds are subject to winterkill, making fish population descriptions inaccurate. We would appreciate any comments and corrections you might have. We would also welcome suggestions on additional ponds (public or private) that could be stocked with fish and would provide future angler opportunities.

About the Program...

The Private Pond Program is a cooperative arrangement between private landowners or public land agencies, and Montana Department of Fish Wildlife & Parks (FWP) to provide free public fishing.

- Private Landowners agree to let the public fish their pond if it is stocked by FWP. However, the landowner does not forfeit any private property rights, including the right to deny access for cause and the right to enforce ranch rules. Landowner permission is required to fish any private pond.
- Landowners and other land managing agencies interested in stocking their ponds should contact FWP. Ponds are checked by FWP for adequate water depth (minimum of 10 feet at full pool). The landowner and FWP then cooperatively decide which fish species would best suit the pond.
- Warm water fish species (bass, bluegill, northern pike, walleye, perch, etc.) generally are stocked once, anticipating they will naturally spawn to continue their population. Generally, warm water species take 2-3 years to grow to a size desired by anglers. Thus, the best ponds usually are stocked with warm water species.
- Rainbow Trout are stocked annually because they do not reproduce in ponds. They are capable of rapid growth; fingerling trout planted in the spring can be eight inches by fall.
- FWP routinely samples stocked ponds to monitor the fish population and pond depth.
- Angler's behavior determines whether or not landowners continue to participate in the program. Courteous, legal, and ethical behavior keeps gates open. Please report any violations to 1-800-TIP-MONT (847-6668).

How To Use This Guide

Flip to the county map where you would like to find a fishing opportunity. The map displays the general location of each pond by a number in a square or circle. Numbers inside squares represent privately owned ponds; these ponds require landowner permission prior to fishing. Numbers in circles represent publicly owned ponds (BLM, State, City).

Following each map is a table listing the ponds located on the corresponding county map. The first series of ponds listed (above the double lines) are stocked with rainbow trout; those listed below the double lines are stocked with warm water fish.

Be sure to read the “NOTES” section for the pond. Valuable information is often provided in this column. For example, the pond has dried up during the recent drought or the size of fish sampled recently may be listed. Some ponds may be closed during a certain time of year!

When you decide on a pond, use the landowner’s directions (when asking for permission) to help in driving to the pond. You may also use the GPS coordinates (using WGS 84 datum), legal description, and pond specific maps to find the pond. It may help to relate all this information to a BLM map, as many of the ponds will be visible on the BLM map. If you continue to have trouble with its location please call the Miles City office for additional advice (406-234-0900).

Please contact us with observations or errors that are found within this book. It will be updated annually to try and stay current with the constantly changing environmental conditions in Southeastern Montana.

Regulations

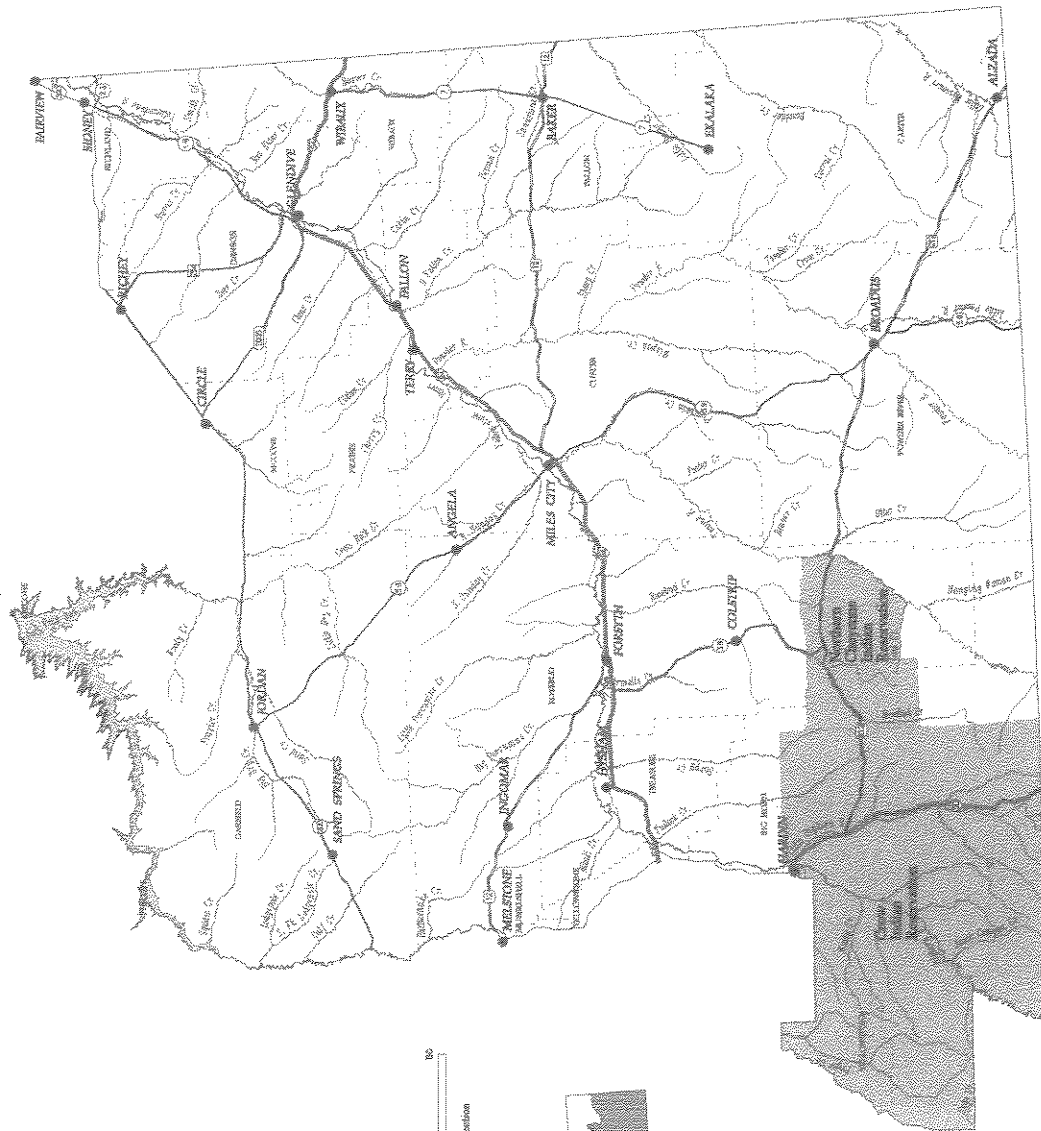
Anglers should become familiar with Montana fishing regulations. The following regulations are a synopsis for pond fishing in Eastern Montana.

- Landowner permission is required to fish privately owned ponds.
- Littering of any kind is illegal and may cause the landowner to close access indefinitely.
- Fish introductions: each year fishing opportunity is lost due to illegal fish introductions. Such introductions may be the result of thoughtless acts (i.e. dumping a bait bucket containing bait fish) or

an intentional, selfish act as when an angler wants to expand “his” opportunity to fish for “his” favorite fish. Regardless of the reason, the result is usually negative. Rainbow trout, for instance, tolerate very little competition from other fish in Eastern Montana ponds; northern pike and yellow perch usually overpopulate and become stunted if not used in the proper species mix and in certain kinds of ponds. FWP stocking decisions are based on the ponds potential for certain species or combination of species, the landowner’s preferences, and other fishing opportunities in the area. Illegally planting fish carries a fine of up to \$5000.00 and loss of hunting and fishing privileges.

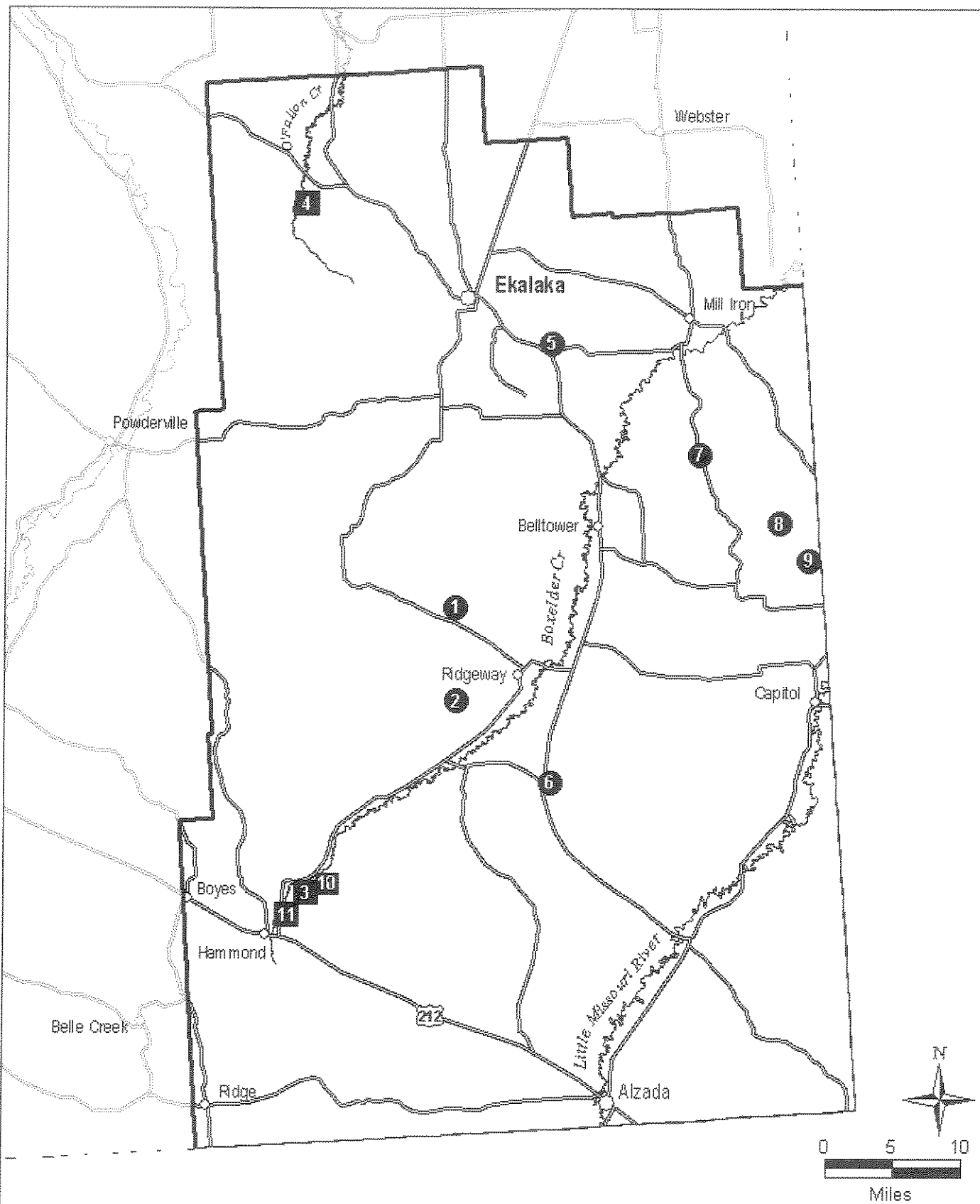
- **Live Bait:** live nongame fish (except sculpins, carp, goldfish, rainbow smelt, all species of sunfish family, bullheads and yellow perch) can be used as bait only in the following ponds in Southeastern Montana: Baker Lake & South Sandstone Res. (Fallon Co.); Buxbaum Perch Res., Kuester Res., Gartside Res. (Richland Co.); Castle Rock Lake, Schlesinger Perch Pond (Rosebud Co.); Doug Gardner #2 Res., Talcott Pond (Carter Co.); Johnson Res., Lindsay Res. (Dawson Co.); Spotted Eagle (Custer Co.); Tongue River Res. (Big Horn Co.); Whiteside Res. (Garfield Co.). For a complete statewide list see the current Montana Fishing Regulations.
- **Warm Water Game Fish Stamp:** a warm water fish stamp is required to possess warm water fish on the following waters in Southeastern Montana: Baker Lake, Maier Res., South Sandstone Res. (Fallon Co.); Beaver Creek (Wibaux Co.); Castle Rock Lake, Schlesinger Res. (Rosebud Co.); Engdahl Cottonwood Res., Trumbo Pond (Garfield Co.); Ft Peck Reservoir; Gartside Lake (Richland Co.); Haughian Res. (Custer Co.); Homestead Res., Silvertip Res. (Prairie Co.); Johnson Dam (Dawson Co.); Talcott Pond (Carter Co.); Tongue River Res. (Big Horn Co.). For a statewide list see current Montana Fishing Regulations.
- **Hook & Line Limits:** two attended lines may be used on Southeastern Montana ponds during the open water period; up to 6 lines may be used through the ice.

Montana Fish Records

If you think you have legally caught a fish in Montana that may be a state record:

- Don't clean or freeze the fish. Keep the fish cool -- preferably on ice. Take a picture of the fish.
- Get the fish weighed as soon as possible on a certified scale (found in grocery or hardware stores, etc.) and witnessed by an observer. Get an affidavit from the store if no FWP official is present. Measure the length.
- Contact the nearest FWP office (406-232-0900) to have the fish positively identified and to determine if it is a state record.

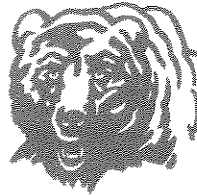

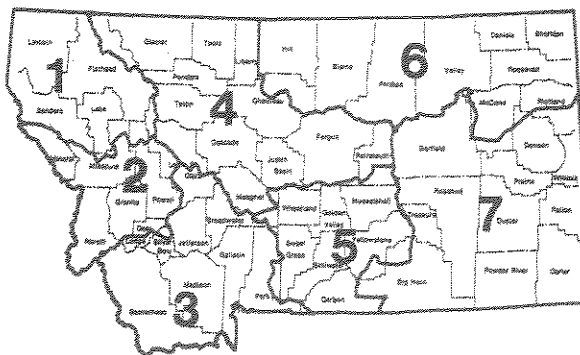

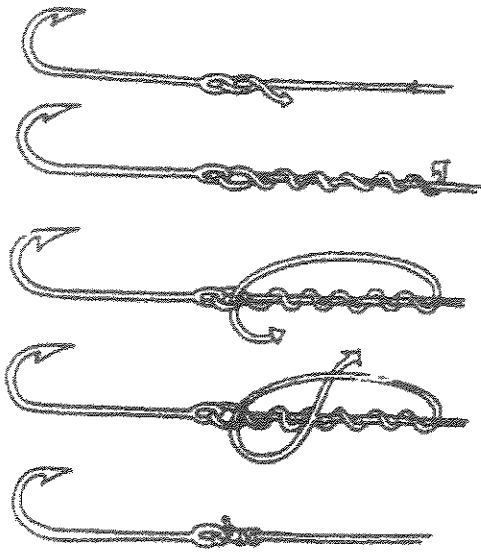

BASIC FISHING LINE KNOTS



CLINCH KNOT

1. Put the end of the line through the eye of the hook and bring it back toward the line.
2. Make five "S" twists around the line.
3. Take the end back toward the hook and push it through the first loop nearest the eye.
4. Bring the end back through the big loop.
5. Hold the hook and the line, pull the knot tight until it looks like the knot shown.

TRILENE KNOT



1. Run the end of the line through the eye of the hook two times.



2. Loop the line around 4 or 5 times, then thread the loose end back between the two loops near the hook as shown.



3. Pull tight. Trim the loose end.

PALOMAR KNOT

1. Start with plenty of line.



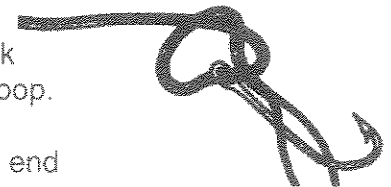
2. Double the line and pass the end through the hook's eye.



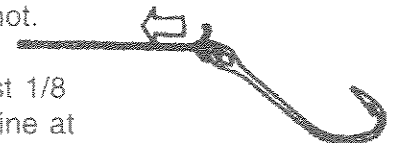
3. Tie an overhand Knot (like you were tying your shoe string) but do not pull it tight yet.



4. Pass the hook through the loop.



5. Pull the loose end of the line to tighten the knot. Trim the end. Leave at least 1/8 inch of your line at the knot.
