#### Item 7. Project Description

This project provides for the construction of motorboat access facilities and associated amenities at the East Bridge site in Billings MT on the Yellowstone River within Yellowstone County, to enhance sport fishing opportunities.

#### 12. <u>Proposed Funding</u>

The costs listed are for direct costs only. Negotiated indirect costs will not be charged because this is a capital project.

No program income will be generated.

Project documents are approved with the understanding that the lease agreement be signed by all parties prior to the initiation of construction.

#### ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS

An Environmental Assessment of activities covered by this project was deemed unnecessary since the size and limited extent of the work falls within the guidelines for categorical exclusion as published by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS) in Vol. 47, No. 127 of the Federal Register. Page 28842, Section 1.4.B(3).

The limitations for categorical exclusions as listed on pages 34-35 of "NEPA in Federal Aid Proposals - Guidance to the States," FWS, September 1980, were considered, and it was determined that there are no conflicts.

In arriving at this decision, the following items were considered:

#### 1. Floodplain Management, E.O. 11988

The proposed site location is within the 100 to 500 year floodplain as identified on the National Flood Insurance Program Rate Map for Yellowstone County, Montana - Panel Number 300142 1030 A (effective date November 18, 1981). The site is protected by fill materials used in the development of road grade and bridge stabilization. No additional modification to the riverbed is proposed. If flooding would occur little damage would result at the site and proposed facilities.

#### 2. Protection of Wetlands, E.O. 11990

The proposed work will not occur in or result in modification of a wetland environment.

#### 3. Farmland Protection Policy Act, P.L. 97-98

Since the proposed area has been extensively disturbed over the years by underground water and fuel line and overhead telephone line placement, little vegetation exists and prime farmland will not be altered or affected. A few cottonwood trees are growing on the site and will be retained. After final construction, possibilities will exist to improve the area visually with tree and ground cover plantings.

#### 4. Historical and Cultural Preservation

It is anticipated that this project will not have any impact on historical or cultural resources. However, it is currently being renewed by the State Historic Preservation Office to determine whether a survey will be required and whether it would have any adverse effect on historic or cultural resources or properties enrolled in or eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places. The SHPO response will be forwarded to FWS and appended to this application as soon as it is available.

#### 5. Endangered Species Act of 1973

The bald eagle and peregrine falcon, both endangered species, use the Yellowstone River drainage as a wintering and roosting area. Eagle numbers on the Billings to Laurel reach of the river total less than five. Falcon numbers are unknown. There are no nest sites within a mile of this site. As this site is extremely small and located adjacent to the Billings urban area, no anticipated impacts are expected to these endangered species.

Activities covered by this project will not have any impact on any other federally listed endangered or threatened species or their designated critical habitats. These other species considered include: black-footed ferret, gray wolf, grizzly bear, eskimo curlew, interior least tern, piping plover, and whooping crane.

#### 6. State Clearinghouse, E.O. 12372

The proposed project has been submitted to the State Clearinghouse for the required 30-day review. If any comments are received they will be forwarded to FWS for consideration and appended to this Application.

State: Montana

Project Title: East Bridge Boat Access

Development: Billings East Bridge Boat Access, Yellowstone County, Montana

#### I. Need

There is currently no boat launching facility, public or private, in the Billings area that provides access to the Yellowstone River. Public access areas owned by the Montana Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks (FWP) are located 30 miles west of Billings (Buffalo Mirage Fishing Access Site) and 40 miles to the east of Billings (Captain Clark Fishing Access Site). The Buffalo Mirage site has a natural boat launch area, but is limited greatly by deposition of gravel. It is not considered a very useable access point by boaters.

Fishing pressure in the Billings-Laurel area of the Yellowstone River is moderately heavy in spite of relatively poor fishing. Proximity of the river to a large population base offsets habitat problems caused by municipal and industrial effluents. Power boating recreation opportunities in south central Montana are scarce and the few bodies of water suitable receive extremely heavy use. The Billings-Laurel reach of the Yellowstone River is lightly used by boaters due to poor access. Significant increases in fishing and boating use of the river would occur if access was improved. The availability and suitability of acquiring an access near Billings has been difficult because few sites acceptable for boat launching are found in this reach due to river channel instability.

In recent years an increasing number of power boats has resulted in greater river use. Groups such as the Montana Jet Boaters Association, Billings Boat Club, Billings Rod and Gun Club and Walleyes Unlimited of Montana have organized to pressure the Department into providing additional access in the Billings area.

The East Bridge proposal is a tract of privately owned land that could meet many of the needs described. Boating access is currently being allowed on the site but use is limited due to poor launching conditions.

#### II. Objective

To develop a boat launching access facility to the Yellowstone River in Billings to provide for an increase in fishing angler-days from 17,000 to 25,000 per year by 1990.

#### III. Expected Benefits

The Yellowstone River in the Billings-Laurel area currently receives approximately 17,000 angler-days of fishing pressure per year. Although fishing pressure is expected to rise 12 percent statewide by 1990 the increase would be much larger on this reach of the Yellowstone if access was improved. With improved access at Billings

and Laurel, a goal of 25,000 angler-days of fishing pressure by 1990 is realistic. Fisheries management plans for the period 1987-92 call for expanding fishing opportunities near Billings, Montana's largest urban area. Research and management efforts on the Yellowstone River will be increased. Acquisition and development of new access points near Billings and Laurel would be a significant step toward increasing fishing opportunities.

#### IV. Approach

The Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks will enter into an agreement with the Lockwood Water Users Association for the right to use their land for the development of a boat launching facility by the Department for a period of 25 years, with an additional 25 year option. A copy of the draft agreement is included as Exhibit A. After FWS approval of the project is received, FWP will execute the final agreement and forward a copy to FWS.

The site encompasses about 1 acre. As noted in section I, limited boating access is currently allowed but no development has occurred.

Construction plans include (figures are estimates pending development of final construction plans):

#### 1. Roadwork

- a. Entry road
- b. Cul-de-sac
- c. Parking--18 spaces
- d. Boat ramp
- e. Boat ramp planks

#### 2. Fencing

- a. 6' chain link
- b. Gate

#### 3. Signing

Final plans and specifications for the project will be developed by the State appointed engineering consultant, in conjunction with FWP engineering staff. Final inspection will be the responsibility of the Department of Administration, Architecture and Engineering Division, and the FWP Design and Construction Bureau.

The construction will be done by a private contractor to be selected through the Department of Administration, Architecture and Engineering Division using the state competitive bid process.

All state and federal permits such as the Montana Stream Protection Act and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Section 404 will be the responsibility of FWP. Credit signs will be posted to identify the project as having been supported by federal aid dollars.

#### Maintenance of Facilities

This proposed facility would receive the same level of maintenance as other FWP facilities. Routine maintenance will be scheduled at the site on a weekly basis and yearly inspections will be conducted to evaluate facility conditions. Maintenance responsibility at this site will be with the Regional Supervisor in FWP Region 5. Maintenance cost is estimated to be approximately \$600 per year. State funds will be used for these costs.

Car counter equipment and surveys will be utilized to monitor use. FWP game wardens will patrol the park to monitor regulation compliance.

It will obtain approval by the appropriate Federal agency of the final working drawings and specifications before the project is advertised or placed on the market for bidding; that it will construct the project, or cause it to be constructed, to final completion in accordance with the application and approved plans and specifications; that it will submit to the appropriate Federal agency for prior approval changes that alter the costs of the project, use of space, or functional layout; that it will not enter into a construction contract(s) for the project or undertake other activities until the conditions of the construction grant program(s) have been met.
- 4. It will provide and maintain competent and adequate architectural engineering supervision and inspection at the construction site to insure that the completed work conforms with the approved plans and specifications; that it will furnish progress reports and such other information as the Federal grantor agency may require.
- 5. It will operate and maintain the facility in accordance with the minimum standards as may be required or prescribed by the applicable Federal, State and local agencies for the maintenance and operation of such facilities.
- 6. It will require the facility to be designed to comply with the "American Standard Specifications for Making Buildings and Facilities Accessible to, and Usable by, the Physically Handicapped," Number All7.1-1961, as modified (41 CFR 101-17.703). The applicant will be responsible for conducting inspections to insure compliance with these specifications by the contractor.
- 7. It will cause work on the project to be commenced within a reasonable time after receipt of notification from the approving Federal agency that funds have been approved and that the project will be prosecuted to completion with reasonable diligence.
- 8. It will not dispose of or encumber its title or other interests in the site and facilities during the period of Federal interest or while the Government holds bonds, whichever is the longer.
- 9. It will comply with requirements of the provisions of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisitions Act of 1970 (P.L. 91-646) which provides for fair and equitable treatment of persons displaced as a result of Federal and federally assisted programs.
- 10. It will comply with the flood insurance purchase requirements of Section 102(a) of the Flood Disaster Protection Act of 1973, Public Law 93-234, 87 Stat. 975, approved December 31, 1976. Section 102(a) requires, on and after March 2, 1975, the purchase of flood insurance in communities where such insurance is available as a condition for the receipt of any Federal financial assistance for construction or acquisition purposes for use in any area that has been identified by the Secretary of the Department of Housing and Urban Development as an area having special flood hazards.
- 11. It will assist the Federal grantor agency in its compliance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 and amended (16 U.S.C. 470) Executive Order 11593, and the Archeological and Historic Preservation Act of 1966 (16 U.S.C. 469a-1 et seq.) by (a) consulting with the State Historic Preservation Officer on the conduct of investigations, as necessary, to identify properties listed in or eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places that are subject to adverse effects (see 36 CFR Part 800.8) by the activity, and notifying the Federal grantor agency of the existence of any such properties, and by (b) complying with all requirements established by the Federal grantor agency to avoid or mitigate adverse effects upon such properties.

#### AMENDMENT TO APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL ASSISTANCE

The purpose of this AFA amendment is to extend the project duration and to increase the funding. The request is to:

- extend the project by 9.5 months, by changing the expiration date from March 14, 1988, to December 31, 1988; and - increase the funding by \$24,000 by changing the funding from \$27,000 to \$51,000.

Additional time is needed in part because a waterline traversing the site had to be insulated and lowered, and a telephone line was relocated. Also, property negotiations with the Lockwood Water Users Association took longer than anticipated. Finally, a land exchange with the Montana Department of Highways that was necessary to obtain property at the west edge of this site took longer than anticipated.

As is shown on the enclosed agreement between the Department of Highways and the Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks, paragraph 5, our Department has been granted the use of the 0.11 acre tract. As is further stated, the property will be conveyed to our Department upon completion of a highway construction project. The two-lane U.S. Highway 87 and bridge will be widened to four. The approach to the bridge passes in part through the 0.11 acre parcel. The design for the road/bridge project has been completed and plans show that it will not encroach onto the boat access site beyond a location shown on a map. For these reasons, the Department is confident of adequate control of the property. We are aware that in the unlikely event that bridge construction intruded unduly onto the boat access site, we might be required to reimburse Federal Aid for a proportionate share.

Additional funding is needed because construction bids were higher than estimated costs. A portion of the additional cost is attributable to the Water Users' insistence that the Department pay a greater share of property fencing costs than was anticipated during early stages of negotiations.

There is no change in the scope of work as described in the original AFA, except for additional fencing.
