

2008 SURVEY OF PROPERTY OWNERS CONCERNING THE MADISON RIVER

This fact sheet provides selected results from a 2008 survey of private landowners who own property along the Madison River in southwest Montana. Data was collected via a mailback survey administered to private property owners in three separate stretches of the river: (1) Hebgen Dam to Lyon Bridge, (2) Lyon Bridge to Ennis Dam, and (3) Ennis Dam to Three Forks, Montana.

(1) HEBGEN DAM TO LYON BRIDGE

As identified from the Montana Cadastral Database, all private landowners who own property touching the Madison River between Hebgen Dam and Lyon Bridge (N=60 landowners in total) were sent a mailback questionnaire concerning the stretch of the Madison River where they own property. A total of 38 landowners completed and returned their survey (resulting in a 63 percent survey response rate).

The following table presents selected survey findings from these landowners.

*This stretch of the river is closed to fishing from boats. However, some anglers float this river stretch, making periodic stops to get out of the boat and fish.

Landowners in this stretch of the river were asked...*Do you have any suggestions or recommendations about how the Madison River should be managed over time?* The most frequently mentioned comments included:

- Concerns about increasing use.
- Concerns about the number of floaters...a need to limit float use.
- Concerns about the number of bank/wade anglers.
- Concerns about too much fishing pressure...becoming too crowded.
- Concerns about trespassing.
- Concerns about recent efforts to establish statewide “setbacks”...related to currently established homes on the river.
- Concerns about increasing development along the river.
- Concerns about the number of out-of-state river guides/outfitters.
- A need for more enforcement on the river.
- Concerns about noxious weeds.

(2) LYON BRIDGE TO ENNIS DAM.

As identified from the Montana Cadastral Database, all private landowners who own property touching the Madison River between Lyon Bridge and Ennis Dam (N=61 landowners in total) were sent a mailback questionnaire concerning the stretch of the Madison River where they own property. A total of 43 landowners completed and returned their survey (resulting in a 70 percent survey response rate).

The following table provides selected survey findings from these landowners.

Landowners in this stretch of the river were asked...*Do you have any suggestions or recommendations about how the Madison River should be managed over time?* The most frequently mentioned comments included:

- Concerns about the number of out-of-state river guides/outfitters.
- Concerns about a high number of float anglers (and their boats) at certain times of the year...diminishing the overall quality of the fishing experience.
- Concerns about trespassing.
- A need for more enforcement on the river.

(3) ENNIS DAM TO THREE FORKS, MONTANA.

As identified from the Montana Cadastral Database, all private landowners who own property touching the Madison River between Ennis Dam and Three Forks, Montana (N=20 landowners in total) were sent a mailback questionnaire concerning the stretch of the Madison River where they own property. A total of 12 landowners completed and returned their survey (resulting in a 60 percent survey response rate).

The following table provides selected survey findings from these landowners.

Landowners in this stretch of the river were asked...*Do you have any suggestions or recommendations about how the Madison River should be managed over time?* The most frequently mentioned comments included:

- Concerns about trespass.
- Concerns about illegal hunting.
- High recreational use at certain times of the year is hard on the fishery.

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
