Title of Job: Development of a Library on Fish Disease and Nutrition
for the Montana Fish and Game Department.

Objectives:

To continue to build a useful and essential library on disease and nutrition.

Techniques Used:

Publications pertaining to trout disease and nutrition acquired by the project leader were cross indexed by subject and bibliography cards were filed by author.

Findings:

Approximately 1700 references to papers on trout disease and nutrition are contained in the bibliography. About 1200 of these publications are in the custody of the project leader and an additional 242 are available at the University library in Missoula. The remaining 258 references are to publications which have not yet been acquired. All available publications, except those in the University library, have been cross-indexed by subject.

Analysis and Recommendations:

Work on the disease and nutrition library should be continued to assure the availability of current information on hatchery problems and their remedies. It is especially important that the subject index be kept up to date on all publications as they become available in order to insure maximum benefit from the library.

Summary:

The trout disease and nutrition library now contains approximately 1700 references of which 1442 are available to the project leader. All but 242 of these have been cross-indexed by subject.

Data and Reports:

The bibliography, subject index, and publications which were obtained for the Montana Fish and Game Department trout disease and nutrition library are in the custody of the project leader in Missoula, Montana.
