SAVE WILD LIFE BY PREVENTING FIRES—MAKE SURE YOUR FIRE IS COMPLETELY OUT AND LEAVE A CLEAN CAMP

- Game Animals—Deer, elk, moose, antelope, caribou, mountain sheep, goat, raccoon and bear.
- Fur-Bearing Animals—Marten or sable, otter, fox, muskrat, fisher, mink, and beaver.
- Predatory Animals—Coyote, wolf, wolverine, mountain lion, wild cat, weasel, skunk and civet cat, black-footed ferret and bobcat.
- Game Fish—All species of the family Salmonidae (chars, trout and salmon); all species of the family Thymallidae (grayling); all species of the family Coregonidae (whitefish); all species of the genus Stizostedion (sand pike or sauger and walleye pike or yellow pikeperch); all species of the genus Esox (northern pike, pickerel and muskellunge); all species of the genus Micropterus (bass).
- Upland Game Birds Sharptailed grouse, blue grouse, prairie chicken, sage hen or sage grouse, fool hen, ruffed grouse, quail, Chinese pheasant and Mongolian pheasant, Hungarian partridge, ptarmigan and wild turkey.
- Migratory Game Birds Waterfowl, including wild ducks, wild geese, brant and swans; cranes, including little brown sand-hill coots and whooping cranes, rails, including gallinules, sora or other rails, shore birds, including avocets, curlew, dowitcher, gotwits, knots, upland plover, killdeer, sandpipers, Wilson snipes or jacksnipes, snipes, stilts, plovers, willets and yellowlegs, and mourning or turtle doves.

FISHING REGULATIONS

Effective May 18, 1952

To be in full force and effect through May 16, 1953, unless otherwise specified, subject to change, however, by the Commission. For up-to-date information, inquire of your license dealer, sportsmen's club or Deputy Game Warden.

Regular Open Season: May 18, 1952 to November 15, 1952, both dates inclusive.

Regular Closed Season: November 16, 1952 to May 16, 1953, both dates inclusive.

The above regulations apply except where otherwise specified in the paragraphs below or under the county regulations following.

Hours of Fishing: Open from 5:00 o'clock a.m. to 9:30 o'clock p.m., Mountain Standard Time, in all waters unless otherwise specified.

Licenses not required for children under fifteen years of age.

All waters operated by the Fish and Game Department and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service as fish hatcheries, rearing ponds, and fish cultural stations within the State shall be closed to fishing at all times.

All waters not mentioned in these Regulations are open to fishing for all species of fish during the regular open season.

The daily bag and possession limit on all species of trout, char, whitefish, and salmon shall be fifteen (15) fish, not to exceed ten (10) pounds and one (1) fish, except where otherwise specified. This daily limit shall not include more than five (5) fish less than seven (7) inches in length.

The daily bag and possession limit on grayling shall be five (5) fish.

The bag limit and possession on pike and pikeperch (walleye pike and sauger) of all species shall be fifteen (15) fish, not to exceed fifteen (15) pounds and one (1) fish in any one day, of which no sauger or walleye pike shall be less than ten (10) inches in length and no northern pike shall be less than eighteen (18) inches in length.

The daily bag and possession limit on bass of all species shall be fifteen (15) pounds and one (1) fish in any one day.

These Regulations shall apply to both fresh game fish and to game fish which have been dried, salted or otherwise preserved, weight limits to be computed by dressed weight, with heads and tails intact.

Chapter 100, Laws of 1949"... It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to transplant or introduce any fish or fish eggs into any body of water in the State, or it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to transplant or introduce any species of game birds or game animals into the State of Montana without first having obtained authorization from the Fish and Game Commission ..."

Means of Taking:

Game Fish shall be taken only by angling, that is by hook and single line in hand or single rod in hand, or within immediate control.

Non-game Fish may be taken in any quantity during the open season by angling or with set lines in waters designated open to set line fishing.

Winter Fishing Gear: Winter fishing gear for waters hereinafter enumerated under county regulations shall consist of not more than two (2) single hooks per line, said hooks not to be larger than size ten (10). Double and treble hooks and single hooks larger than size ten (10) shall be prohibited.

Minnows of non-game fish variety may be taken with a seine not to exceed twelve (12) feet in length, three (3) feet in width, and one-quarter (1/4) inch mesh only in counties hereinafter mentioned where the regulation allows the use of same. Use of minnow seines in all other counties unlawful; snares or fish traps unlawful to use or have in possession.

Sculpins (Cottus) may be used for bait in all waters in Montana. These may be taken with window screen or a piece of net-

ting not to exceed four (4) feet in length.

All waters of the State shall be closed to fishing with carp and goldfish, dead or alive, used as bait, with the exception that carp may be used in the following designated water: Missouri River and its main stem impoundments, from the North Dakota line to Three Forks: Milk River from Chinook to the confluence with the Missouri River; Musselshell River from Roundup to Fort Peck Reservoir; Yellowstone River from the bridge on Highway 12 at Laurel to the North Dakota line, and all tributary streams entering the Yellowstone River from Forsyth to the North Dakota line.

Snagging of fish is unlawful at all times except as provided

for under Sockeye fishing regulations.

Sale or possession of salmon eggs or imitations thereof shall be

absolutely prohibited.

Set-lines shall not be permitted unless specifically stated otherwise. When set-lines are permitted, said set-line is not to exceed one hundred (100) feet and not more than six (6) hooks shall be attached thereto.

Floats on set-lines prohibited.

It is prohibited to use ground or chipped meat, fish or other food products "to bait a hole" in any fishing waters. (This does not prohibit the use of meat or non-game fish for bait.)

Sockeye Fishing Regulations During Spawning Season: From October 1, 1952 to December 15, 1952, both dates inclusive, the limit on sockeye salmon shall be thirty-five (35) fish per day and not more than two days' limit in possession in waters hereinafter enumerated under County Regulations.

The remainder of the year between May 1, 1952 and April 30,

1953, the regular possession limit shall prevail.

In these waters, snagging sockeys with a combination of three hooks shall be permitted from October 1, 1952 to December 15, 1952, both dates inclusive. During the balance of the open season, the general fishing regulations shall be in force.

REAVERHEAD COUNTY

Closed Entire Year: That portion of the Big Hole River from Divide Dam to three hundred (300) feet below Divide Dam and Upper and Lower Red Rock and Swan Lakes.

Open Entire Year: None.

Other Than Regular Season: Fishing shall be allowed in Red Rock Creek from Lima Dam to its confluence with Horse Prairie. the Beaverhead River from the confluence of Red Rock Creek and Horse Prairie Creek to its confluence with the Jefferson River, from December 1, 1952 to February 28, 1953, both dates inclusive.

Fishing shall be allowed in open water only for all species of fish in the Big Hole River below the bridge which spans the river at Divide, to the Beaverhead-Madison County line from December

1, 1952 to February 28, 1953, both dates inclusive.

All winter fishing shall have a limit of fifteen (15) game fish of which no more than three (3) may be trout, and only winter fishing gear may be used.

All lakes shall be open to fishing from July 1, 1952 to November 15, 1952, both dates inclusive, with the exception of Elk and Brown's Lake which are to be governed by the regular open season and except those closed entire year.

All streams tributary to Upper and Lower Red Rock Lakes shall be open to fishing from July 1, 1952 to November 15, 1952, both

dates inclusive.

Antelope and Poison Creeks in Beaverhead County shall be open to fishing from July 1, 1952 to November 15, 1952, both dates inclusive.

Set-Line Fishing: None.

Minnow Seines and Small Fish for Bait: Minnow seines not allowed. Small fish for bait with the exception of sculpins (Cottus) not allowed.

Other: Blacktail Creek from its intersection with Highway 91 to its confluence with the Beaverhead River shall be closed to fishing by persons thirteen (13) years of age and over.

BIG HORN COUNTY

Closed Entire Year: None.

Open Entire Year: The Bighorn River, the Little Bighorn River from its confluence with the Bighorn River to the Highway 87 bridge at the Francis Eggart Ranch, Willow Creek Reservoir. Tonque River, Tonque River Reservoir, and for fishing of warm water fishes only, all other reservoirs.

Other Than Regular Season: None.

Set-Line Fishing: None.

Minnow Seines and Small Fish for Bait: Use Allowed.

Other: The creel limit on Willow Creek Reservoir shall be five (5) fish, not to exceed ten (10) pounds and one (1) fish per day. All reservoirs with the exception of Willow Creek Reservoir shall be open at all hours for the fishing of warm water fishes.

BLAINE COUNTY

Closed Entire Year: None.

Open Entire Year: The Milk River, Missouri River, and all Reservoirs north of Highway No. 2 shall be open to fishing with the following exception: Rock Coulee Reservoir.

Other Than Regular Season: None.

Set-Line Fishing: Missouri River. Minnow Seines and Small Fish for Bait: Use Allowed. Other: All Reservoirs north of Highway No. 2 shall be open at all hours for the fishing of warm water fishes.

BROADWATER COUNTY

Closed Entire Year: That portion of the Missouri River within three hundred (300) feet below Toston Dam.

Deep Creek and all its tributaries above the Russell Fork bridge.

Open Entire Year: The Missouri River.

Other Than Regular Season: None. Set-Line Fishing: The Missouri River from Three Forks to Holter Dam shall be closed to set line fishing from March 1 to June 30 each year, both dates inclusive, and open the remainder of the year.

Minnow Seines and Small Fish for Balt: Use not allowed, except sculpins (Cottus) may be used and all non-game fish may be used

in the Missouri River. Other: None.

CARBON COUNTY

Closed Entire year: The first West Fork of Rock Creek shall be closed to all fishing permanently from the mouth of Washoe Creek (near Wild Bill Lake) to its confluence with the main stream of Rock Creek.

Open Entire Year: Yellowstone River and Clark Fork of the

Yellowstone River in Carbon County. Other Than Regular Season: None.

Set-Line Fishing: Clarks Fork of the Yellowstone River from the first bridge north of Belfry, Montana, to its confluence with the

Yellowstone River near Laurel, Montana.

Minnow Seines and Small Fish for Bait: Use not allowed with the following exceptions: Sculpins (Cottus) allowed. Use allowed in the Yellowstone River, in Bluewater Creek from its confluence with the Clark Fork River to the bridge immediately below the Bluewater Rearing Station, in Red Lodge Creek and Cooney Dam from its confluence with Rock Creek to the first bridge above Cooney Dam, in Rock Creek from its confluence with the Clark Fork River to its confluence with Red Lodge Creek, in the Clark Fork River from its confluence with the Yellowstone River to the first bridge north of Belfry, Montana.

Other: For that portion of the Yellowstone River lying within Carbon County from November 15, 1952 to February 28, 1953, both dates inclusive, the daily limit of game fish shall be thirty

(30) of which not more than three (3) may be trout.

CARTER COUNTY

Closed Entire Year: None. Open Entire Year: All reservoirs shall be open to fishing.

Other Than Regular Season: None.

Set-Line Fishing: The Little Missouri River and Box Elder Creek shall be open the entire year.

Minnow Seines and Small Fish for Bait: Use allowed. Other: All reservoirs shall be open at all hours for fishing of warm water fishes.

CASCADE COUNTY

Closed Entire Year: Middle Creek Dam and its tributaries and the Entire Middle Creek from the dam to its confluence with Wooden Shoe Creek.

That portion of Giant Springs enclosed or surrounded by the concrete walks and masonry work.

Spring Creek Reservoir at the Sieben ranch at Adel on the East Fork of Hound Creek.

Open Entire Year: Tintinger Sloughs, Missouri River except as provided below and all reservoirs for the fishing of warm water fishes.

Other Than Regular Season: That portion of the Missouri River from the Giant Springs Channel between the island and the upper end of the Great Falls State Fish Hatchery property to a point approximately fifty (50) feet below the lower pond, a distance of about three hundred and fifty (350) feet, and extending three hundred (300) feet out into the river channel, shall be closed to fishing from November 16 to May 17 and open during the regular season.

That portion of the Sun River in Cascade County shall be open to fishing from December 1 to February 28, of each year, both dates inclusive, the limit to be fifteen (15) fish of which three (3) may be trout. Only winter fishing gear may be used.

Set-Line Fishing: Missouri River below Morony Dam.

Minnow Seines and Small Fish for Bait: Seines not allowed. Sculpins (Cottus) allowed and small fish allowed only in the Missouri River and Sun River in Cascade County.

Other: All Reservoirs shall be open to fishing of warm water fishes at all hours.

CHOUTEAU COUNTY

Closed Entire Year: None.

Open Entire Year: That portion of the Marias River and the Teton River lying within Chouteau County, and the Missouri River. All Reservoirs to the fishing of warm water fishes. Other Than Regular Season: None.

Set-Line Fishing: The Missouri River; Marias and Teton Rivers in Chotegu County only.

Minnow Seines and Small Fish for Bait: Use allowed. Other: All Reservoirs shall be open to fishing of warm water fishes at all hours.

CUSTER COUNTY

Closed Entire Year: Experimental pond on John Holdbrook Ranch in Sec. 7 T 5N, R 48E.

Open Entire Year: All waters except pond closed entire year. Other Than Regular Season: None.

Set-Line Fishing: The Yellowstone River and the Powder River. Minnow Seines and Small Fish for Bait: Use allowed.

Other: All reservoirs shall be open for fishing of warm water fishes at all hours except the pond closed entire year.

DANIELS COUNTY

Closed Entire Year: None.

Open Entire Year: All reservoirs, the Poplar River and Wolf Creek.

Other Than Regular Season: None.

Set-Line Fishing: None.

Minnow Seines and Small Fish for Bait: Use allowed.

Other: All reservoirs shall be open for fishing of warm water fishes at all hours.

DAWSON COUNTY

Closed Entire Year: None.

Open Entire Year: All waters except as provided below. Other Than Regular Season: Johnson and Lindsay Reservoirs shall be closed to fishing from May 1 to June 15 of each year and open thereafter until April 30.

Set-Line Fishing: The Yellowstone River except that portion from the intake Dam to the Ferry Cable which shall be closed through-

out the entire year.

Minnow Seines and Small Fish for Bait: Use allowed. Other: All reservoirs shall be open for fishing of warm water fishes at all hours.

DEER LODGE COUNTY

Closed Entire Year: Big Spring in Georgetown Lake, in an area designated by piles or buoys for a distance of two hundred (200) feet north and south on the shore line out into the lake.

Flint Creek where it empties into Georgetown Lake shall be closed from its mouth at Georgetown Lake to the Granite County line, that part of Stewart Mill Creek above where the fence crosses it on Bowman's pasture, and Hartdla Creek between Georgetown and Silver Lakes shall be closed the entire year.

Open Entire Year: None. Other Than Regular Season: Excepting Georgetown Lake and Silver Lake all other lakes and their tributaries shall be closed to fishing from November 15 to June 30, each year and shall be open during the balance of the regular fishing season.

The first bay on Georgetown Lake southeast of the dam next to Highway 10A, and that portion of Georgetown Lake within a radius of three hundred (300) feet from the mouth of Flint Creek shall be closed to fishing from July 1, 1952 to July 31, 1952, both dates inclusive and shall be open during the balance of the regular fishing season, and during the winter season.

Georgetown Lake shall be open to fishing from July 1 to November 15, both dates inclusive, and closed to all fishing from November 16 to November 30, and from March 1 to June 30 each year, both dates inclusive. Fishing for all species of fish shall be allowed in Georgetown Lake between the hours of 5:00 o'clock a. m. to 9:30 o'clock p. m., Mountain Standard Time, on Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays from December 1, 1952 to February 28, 1953, both dates inclusive.

Fishing shall be allowed in open waters or through a hole in the ice for all species of fish in Silver Lake from December 1, 1952 to February 28, 1953, both dates inclusive and shall be open to fishing from July 1, 1952 to November 15, 1952 and closed throughout the remainder of the year.

Set-Line Fishing: None. Minnow Seines and Small Fish for Bait: Use not allowed except sculpins (Cottus) may be used and shiners from Georgetown Lake

may be used in said Lake.

Other: The limit in Georgetown Lake shall be ten (10) fish in the aggregate and not to exceed ten (10) pounds and one (1) fish in any one day.

That portion of Warm Springs Creek from the bridge at the city dump road west to the Lescantz Bridge on Highway No. 10-A shall be closed to fishing by persons thirteen (13) years of age and over.

FALLON COUNTY

Closed Entire Year: Experimental pond on Rieger Brothers' Ranch in Sec. 22 T 8N, R 56E.

Open Entire Year: All waters with the exception of the pond. closed the entire year.

Other Than Regular Season: None.

Set-Line Fishing: Box Elder Creek and O'Fallon Creek. Minnow Seines and Small Fish for Bait: Use allowed. Other: All waters open to fishing at all hours for warm water fish except that pond closed the entire year.

FERGUS COUNTY

Closed Entire Year: None. Open Entire Year: All reservoirs and the Judith River, from the confluence with Big Spring Creek to the confluence with Missouri River, and the Missouri River.

Other Than Regular Season: Crystal Lake shall be open to fishing from July 1, 1952 to February 28, 1953, both dates inclusive. Set-Line Fishing: Missouri River.

Minnow Seines and Small Fish for Bait: Use allowed.

Other: None.

FLATHEAD COUNTY

Closed Entire Year: The Swan River from the hydroelectric plant to the highway bridge and from the Big Fork Dam to three hundred (300) feet below the dam; Smith Lake (north of Whitefish Lake); the stream between Middle and Big Ashley Lakes; all tributaries to Roger's Lake and Roger's Lake within an area of three hundred (300) feet in all directions from where these tributaries enter the lake; Stillwater River from the Northwest Dam to three hundred (300) feet below the dam.

Herrig Creek, a tributary of the Bitterroot Lake; Bitterroot Lake within an area of three hundred (300) feet in all directions from where Herrig Creek enters; all tributaries of Big Ashley Lake, Big Ashley Lake within an area of three hundred (300) feet in all directions from where these tributaries enter the Lake, Hatchery or Rand Bay; Big Ashley Lake (Upper Ashley) for a distance of three hundred (300) feet in all directions from the outlet. South Fork of the Flathead River from Highway bridge on Highway No. 2 to Hungry Horse Dam.

Big Creek, Coal Creek and Whale Creek, tributaries to the North Fork of the Flathead River, shall be closed to fishing during

the entire year.

Trail Creek shall be closed entire year from where it comes out of the ground, approximately 5 miles above the North Fork Road. to the Flathead River, Haskell Creek and tributaries from the Whitefish public water intake to its source. Spoon Lake (Nine Mile Lake) shall be closed to fishing.

Open Entire Year: Flathead Lake, except that portion of the two thousand (2,000) feet into the lake in every direction from the mouth of the Flathead and Swan Rivers, which shall be closed each year from March 1st to the beginning of the general fishing season; and that portion in front of the Somers Hatchery property line three hundred (300) feet out into the lake which shall be closed from October 1 to December 15, both dates inclusive, each vear.

Whitefish Lake, except that portion of the lake within a radius of two hundred (200) feet of the mouth of Swift Creek at the upper end of the lake, which shall be closed each year from November

15 to June 30, both dates inclusive.

McWininger Slough, Emmert Slough, Egan Slough, Lake Five, and Mud Lake, adjoining, Half Moon Lake, Lake Blaine, Fenny Slough, Blanchard Lake, Upper and Lower Stillwater Lakes, Sam-sen Lake, Spencer Lake, Echo Lake and Peterson Lake, adjoining, Skyles Lake, Meadow Lake, Smith Lake (Kila area), McGregor Lake and Middle Ashley Lake.

Other Than Regular Season: The following lakes: Bootjack, Fire, Finger, Dog, Hole in the Wall, Thornburg, Big and Little Martin, Chinook, Beaver, Dollar, Doyle, Hansen and Murray shall be closed to fishing for all species of fish from October 1, 1952 to November 30, 1952, both dates inclusive, and shall be open during the remainder of the year.

Swift Creek, in its entirety, shall be open to fishing from July 1, 1952 to November 15, 1952, both dates inclusive, and closed during the remainder of the year.

Big Ashley Lake shall be open to fishing from June 10, 1952 to November 15, 1952, both dates inclusive, the daily limit of fish to be five (5), not to exceed ten (10) pounds and one (1) fish.

Other Than Regular Season: That portion of the Clark Fork River from three hundred (300) feet below the Bonner Dam to the Missoula-Mineral County line shall be closed to fishing from March I to the beginning of the regular fishing season, each year, and open the balance of the year.

Other: The use of any trolling device with more than two (2) blades and Rudder, said blades not to be larger than one and onehalf (11/2) inches in the longest dimension shall be prohibited in Placid Lake.

Rattlesnake Creek from Montana Power Co. Dam to its confluence with the Clark Fork River shall be closed to fishing by per-

sons thirteen (13) years of age and over.

Other: All reservoirs except Miller Lake open to fishing of warm water fish at all hours.

Closed Entire Year: That portion of the headwaters of the Upper Main Boulder River above Coles Bridge.

Open Entire Year: Yellowstone River.

Other Than Regular Season: Aldrich Lake shall be open to fishing from December 1, 1952 to February 28, 1953, both dates inclusive and during the general fishing season.

Dailey Lake shall be open to fishing from December 1, 1952 to February 28, 1953, both dates inclusive and during the regular open season.

In addition to the regular season, the Shields River from the Poor Bridge above Wilsall to its confluence with the Yellowstone River shall be open to whitefishing only from December 1, 1952 to February 28, 1953, both dates inclusive, and only winter fishing gear shall be used. Set-Line Fishing: None.

Minnow Seines and Small Fish for Bait: Use not allowed except that sculpins (Cottus) may be used for bait, and small non-game fish from the Yellowstone River, with the exception of carp, may

be used in the Yellowstone River.

Other: For that portion of the Yellowstone River lying within Park County from November 15, 1952 to February 28, 1953, both dates inclusive, the daily limit of game fish shall be thirty (30) of which not more than three (3) may be trout.

The Sacajawea Lagoon in Sacajawea Park, Livingston, to its confluence with the Yellowstone River shall be closed to fishing

by persons thirteen (13) years of age and over.

PETROLEUM COUNTY

Closed Entire Year: Patrolia Reservoir.

Open Entire Year: All waters except Patrolia Reservoir.

Other Than Regular Season: None.

Set-Line Fishing: Missouri River and the Musselshell River in Petroleum, Musselshell, Rosebud and Garfield Counties.

Minnow Seines and Small Fish for Bait: Use allowed. Other: All waters except Patrolia Reservoir open at all hours to fishing of warm water fish.

Fort Peck Reservoir is subject to U. S. Coast Guard regulation governing the operation of watercraft on navigable streams.

PHILLIPS COUNTY

Closed Entire Year: None.

Open Entire Year: All waters except the drain canal at McNeil Station rearing pond and the Bowdoin Wildlife Refuge.

Other Than Regular Season: The Bowdoin Wildlife Refuge shall be open to fishing from July 16, 1952 to September 15, 1952, both dates inclusive and closed the balance of the year.

Set-Line Fishing: Missouri River.

Minnow Seines and Small Fish for Bait: Use allowed.

Other: All waters open at all hours to fishing of warm water fish.

Fort Peck Reservoir is subject to U. S. Coast Guard regulations governing the operation of watercraft on navigable streams.

PONDERA COUNTY

Closed Entire Year: Black Tail Creek in Pondera County. Open Entire Year: Marias River and the Dry Fork of Marias River.

Other Than Regular Season: The inlet canal to Lake Francis from the Kunkle drop to its mouth and a portion of Lake Francis included within a radius of 300 feet of the mouth of said canal shall be open to fishing from July 1, 1952 to February 28, 1953, both dates inclusive, and closed during the balance of the year.

Lake Francis shall be open to fishing from the beginning of the regular open season to February 28, both dates inclusive,

each year, and closed during the balance of the year.

In addition to the regular season, the Little Blackfoot River from where the highway bridge crosses at Elliston to its confluence with the Clark Fork River shall be open to fishing for whitefish only on Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays from Dec. 1. 1952 to February 28, 1953, both dates inclusive, and only winter fishing gear shall be used.

In addition to the regular season, the Big Blackfoot River shall be open to fishing for whitefish only in its entirety in Powell County from Dec. 1, 1952 to February 28, 1953, both dates inclusive, and only winter fishing gear shall be used.

Set-Line Fishing: None.

Minnow Seines and Small Fish for Bait: Use not allowed except sculpins (Cottus) which are allowed.

Other: Cottonwood Creek near Deer Lodge from its confluence with the Clark Fork River to the confluence of the South Fork of Cottonwood Creek shall be closed to fishing by all persons thirteen (13) years of age and over.

PRAIRIE COUNTY

open to fishing from July 15, 1952 to February 28, 1953, both
dates inclusive.

Arnold Drain from the Billings Bench Water Users Canal to the N. P. Industrial Site access road, Danford Drain and Hogan Slough shall be closed to fishing by persons thirteen (13) years

of age and over.

NOTICE OF NEW LAW

It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to transplant or introduce any fish or fish eggs into any body of water in the State, or it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to transplant or introduce any species of game birds or game animals into the State of Montana without first having obtained authorization from the Fish and Game Commission.

IT IS UNLAWFUL

To refuse to show license on demand.

To use more than single pole and/or single line.

To sell or offer for sale any game or game fish.

To transport or ship game or game fish out of the State without a shipping permit.

To empty a minnow bucket (release live fish) into any body of water.

To use or have in possession salmon eggs or salmon spawn or any imitations thereof.

To use set-lines except in such water as designated under proper order of the State Fish and Game Commission.

To use or have in possession a fish spear.

To have more than five (5) game fish under seven (7) inches in length in your possession.

To shoot fish with rifle or gun.

To use any carbide, lime, giant powder, dynamite, or other explosive compounds, or any corrosive or narcotic poison or to have any of same in one's possession within one hundred (100) feet of any stream where fish are found for the purpose of stunning or killing fish.

To loan or transfer your fishing or hunting license or any tags from said license to any person.

FISHERMEN NOTICE!

Fishing cannot be greatly improved until the Fish and Game Commission has more information available. One of the greatest needs is catch data. Sportsmen interested in cooperating to improve fishing are requested to mail a card to the Helena office asking for a Fisherman's Log in which they may enter their catch records. Please do not make this request out of curiosity, but only if you are truly interested in cooperating by keeping an account of your catch records.
