
2016-2017 Performance-Based Shoulder Season Review Fish & Wildlife Commission August 9, 2018

### MCA 87-1-323

(3) The department shall:

(a) manage with the objective that populations of elk, deer, and antelope are at or below the sustainable population number [i.e. Population Objective] by January 1, 2009

In summer 2014, FWP Director Jeff Hagener authorized an internal process to explore and develop guidelines for the 2016–2017 biennial elk season setting process. This was in response to Gov. Bullock's charge to improve landowner relations and specifically in response to criticism that FWP was not meeting elk objectives.




## **Performance-Based Shoulder Seasons**

In response to Legislative, Gubernatorial, Director's and Commission direction

## Primary intent of shoulder seasons is to reduce elk populations to objective.

- Firearms seasons that occurs outside the 5-week general firearms season and focuses on antlerless elk harvest on private land.
- Not intended to replace or reduce harvest during archery and general firearms seasons.
- Have "performance criteria" regarding the timing, make-up and number of elk to be harvested in order to maintain the season.



#### **FUNDAMENTAL OBJECTIVES**

#### **Elk considerations:**

- Manage elk populations to objective as rapidly as possible.
- Increase harvest of elk, where appropriate.

#### Hunter and landowner considerations:

- Address problematic distributions of elk and elk harvest.
- Enhance free public access to bulls and cows on private land during the general seasons.
- Reduce exclusive access to elk.
- Enhance landowner flexibility to manage elk hunting on their property.
- Reduce game damage.
- Reduce hunter impacts on landowners (e.g., cost of hiring additional staff, loss of productivity, property damage from hunters, etc.).
- Simplify rules and regulations.

#### **Logistical considerations:**

- Balance statewide consistency with local flexibility of regulations, rules, and policies.
- Keep staff time and cost down.

#### Performance-Based Shoulder Season Harvest Criteria – evaluated on a 3-year basis

- The number of bulls and cows (each evaluated separately) harvested during the archery-only and 5week general seasons is more than half (>50%) the number of bulls and cows recruited AND
- 2. The **total harvest of cows during all seasons combined** (archery, 5-week firearms and shoulder seasons) is more than the number of cows recruited **AND**
- 3. The total harvest of all elk (including calves) during all seasons combined is more than the total number of elk recruited OR
- 4. If harvest criteria have not been met due to clear and widely accepted extenuating circumstances (e.g., weather, forest fire, etc.), the shoulder season may be continued, as long as access to elk during the general season is not considered to be the main reason harvest criteria are not being met.

#### OR:

6. Other shoulder seasons not subject to the above harvest criteria are allowed if they are consistent with the fundamental objectives and have broad, expressed support from landowners, sportsmen, FWP and the Commission.

#### 2016-2017 ELK SHOULDER SEASONS



Shoulder seasons will be offered in 43 hunting districts.

A shoulder season is a firearms season that occurs outside the 5-week general firearms season. The seasons focus on antierless elk harvest on **private land** and are not intended to replace or reduce harvest during the existing general archery and 5-week general firearms season.

In order for shoulder seasons to be effective, everyone must work together – FWP, landowners and sportsmen.

Hunters can use their General Elk License or Elk B License, obtained through a limited drawing or over-the-counter (OTC), depending on the hunting district.

Application deadline for limited B Licenses is June 1. OTC and any surplus B Licenses are available for purchase beginning August 8. Check for availability at fwp.mt.gov.

  - 10 in Region 5
  - 8 in Region 6



## The 2016 Season = Poor

"This season was quite a contrast to 2015--harvest was down 30-50% in all my districts, for both the general and shoulder, due to the unseasonably mild weather. It will be important to put this in context, if asked, b/c both access and landowner participation actually increased for 2016 despite the lower harvest success."




Montana 2016 and 2017 combined Montana Shoulder Season Performance Critera Evaluation. Green cell = meets criteria, orange = does not meet

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## **Shoulder Seasons**

## Summary

- 2016 was a Bad Elk Hunting Year
  - Mild Fall & Snowy Winter. Even so, cow harvest was 33% above previous 5-year average
- 2017 cow harvest was 47% above previous average
- Long Late Season did better than Short
  - Overall, long seasons achieved 108% of needed cow harvest
  - Short seasons achieved 58% of needed cow harvest
- There did not appear to be a shift away from general season harvest
- Population counts reflect a change
