Region 3 Law Enforcement Issues – Adam Pankratz, Warden Captain

Discussed the guiding principles of what wardens do and how they do it (Law Enforcement Code of Ethics).

7 Pillars of North American Model for Wildlife Conservation

- Wildlife is a public resource

- Wildlife is an international resource
- No markets for game
- Laws regulate wildlife management
- Wildlife only killed for legitimate reason
- Management by science
- Democracy of hunting/fishing (available to all)

Overview of FWP Enforcement Division

- Staffing across the region
- Districts/geographic area our staff covers
- Duties
 - Protecting our waters
 - Destruction of state park property
 - Education/mentoring the next generation
 - Protecting public access
 - Urban wildlife
 - Public outreach
 - Bison management
 - Enforcing rules and regulations of MTFWP
 - Outdoor recreation
 - Hunting, fishing, trapping regulation
 - Commercial activities
 - Land owner relations

Discussed a few specific cases enforcement has worked on over the years and across the region.

Pittman-Robertson (PR) Funding

- 2 years ago, funding increased from ~4% to ~30%
- Strict guidelines of what funding can be used for
- Funding changed again in last legislative session back down to 15%
- Discussed hardships of PR funding for enforcement and why the decrease in funding was positive for the division

CAD

- shared system between highway patrol and wardens
- Way for dispatch to know where they are and dispatch efficiently
- Access to driver's license records, fishing/hunting license records
- Helps enforce our laws better
- Extra layer of transparency for the agency and increased efficiency

distributed the enforcement division's new annual report

CAC Round Table and Public Comment

Discussed the following topics:

- Funding for noxious weed mgmt. at WMAs
- Work cooperatively with county efforts
- Success story on Ruby River: 4th public access site on river in less than two years
- Brief synopsis from Captain Pankratz regarding internal meeting on Herrera decision
- More aggravation and negative comments from hunters than positive regarding the bison hunt in Gardiner (Pros and cons of having a state hunt)
- Governor's Sheep Tag: we don't allow market hunting, but we allow private landowners to lease land to hunters/professional scouts
 - Political decisions vs science-based decisions
- Using dogs to detect AIS (mussel sniffing dogs)
- Contention about "no wake zone" at the Silos when we don't have the work force to enforce it
