Grizzly bears were once pushed to the brink of extinction in the lower 48 states, so in 1975 they were listed for protection under the Endangered Species Act (ESA). While some progress has been made over the past 40-plus years to recover grizzly bear populations, today there are still only an estimated 1,500 grizzlies in the contiguous 48 states and they are found within less than 2 percent of their historic range. Grizzly bears have very low reproductive rates and continue to face excessive death rates caused by cars, trains, hunters claiming self-defense, poaching, livestock-related "control" actions, and other heavy-handed management. In fact, the last two years have seen record-breaking grizzly deaths in Montana.

The grizzly bear is still protected by the ESA, but your great state of Montana is considering allowing trophy hunting of grizzlies once they are de-listed from the ESA. Governor's Grizzly Bear Advisory Council Public Comments

In life and in business, you are either part of the problem or part of the solution. I sincerely hope the Montana Grizzly Bear Advisory Council will choose to be a significant part of the solution rather than a major part of the problem.

Thanks to decades of advocacy by caring individuals like me, grizzly bears in the lower-48 states are currently protected under the Endangered Species Act (ESA), making it illegal to harm, harass, or kill these bears, except in cases of self-defense.

Unfortunately, the state of Montana is currently considering a plan to authorize trophy hunting of grizzly bears as soon as ESA protections are removed. I am speaking up for grizzlies by letting the Montana Grizzly Bear Advisory Council know that I strongly oppose trophy hunting.

A lawsuit against the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) in 2017, when the agency illegally tried to strip ESA protections from grizzly bears living in the Greater Yellowstone region, was successful. At that time, the suit also successfully blocked planned grizzly bear trophy hunts in Idaho and Wyoming.

We've stopped grizzly bear trophy hunting before, and now I ask the Montana Grizzly Bear Advisory Council to protect the Great Bear once again!

Thank you for the opportunity to submit comments. I strongly oppose trophy hunting of grizzly bears in Montana. While the grizzly bear is slowly recovering after near-extermination, these majestic species remain absent from nearly 98 percent of their historic range.

I and many others who love these bears have worked so hard for four decades to bring the grizzly bear back from the brink of extinction, so the idea that Montana would authorize trophy hunting is discouraging and distressing. Trophy hunting is unethical and a vestige from a bygone era. It is particularly inappropriate for this iconic grizzly bear that is still imperiled and has a very slow reproduction rate.

Grizzlies face continuing threats from climate change, dwindling key food resources, illegal poaching, lack of connectivity among populations, and the negative impacts from roads and railroad tracks fragmenting their habitat. In fact, the past two years saw record rates of grizzly bear mortality in Montana. Trophy hunting of grizzly bears in Montana will only lead to a further decline of an already fragile population and would make a connected metapopulation-essential for recovery of the species-a near impossibility.

There is no evidence that trophy hunting is effective at managing grizzly bear populations. Studies show that trophy hunting does not reduce human-bear or livestock-bear conflict. Research also shows that trophy hunting does not increase social acceptance, but may have the opposite impact.

The Council must take into consideration the perspectives of Tribal Nations, many of which consider the Great Bear sacred.

If grizzly bears are delisted, at the very least, Montana must wait to see how they do without the Endangered Species Act's protections before allowing trophy hunting. It's just too soon to consider hunting. In 2017, Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks (FWP) recognized that a hunt should not be proposed immediately after delisting.

The #1 animal that tourists, who contribute about \$1 billion annually to the economy of the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem, hope to see in Montana is a grizzly bear. Bears are not only revered by many, but they are also very valuable to our nature-based economy.

Montana FWP and the Fish and Wildlife Commission must update the inaccurate and outdated Grizzly Bear Policy, which mistakenly states trophy hunting is an effective tool to prevent human-bear and livestock-bear conflict. Montana FWP should also put its energy and resources into assisting communities and recreationalists to prevent bear-human and bear-livestock conflict.

Again, I strongly oppose trophy hunting of grizzly bears in Montana. Please choose to be part of the solution rather than a force for the extinction of this remarkable species, a major tourist draw for Montana's economy.

The Grizzly Bear is the quintessential symbol of wilderness, especially in parts of the western United States and Alaska where this great bear still lives.

In the recent past, grizzly bears were pushed to the brink of extinction in the lower 48 states, because of this they were listed for protection under the Endangered Species Act (ESA) in 1975. While some progress has been made over the last 40-plus years in the recovery of grizzly bear populations, today there are still only an estimated 1,923 (based on federal 2019 Bear Recovery Report) grizzlies in the entire contiguous 48 states and they are currently found within less than 2 percent of their historic range. Grizzly bears have very low reproductive rates and continue to face excessive death rates caused by cars, trains, hunters claiming self-defense, poaching, livestock-related "control" actions, and other heavy-handed management. In fact, the last two years have seen record-breaking grizzly deaths in Montana.

Although the grizzly bear is still protected by the Endangered Species Act, the state of Montana is now considering allowing trophy hunting of grizzlies once they are de-listed from the ESA. Such hunting would be allowed on public lands, including wild lands within America's National Wilderness Preservation System and wild public lands immediately adjacent to Yellowstone and Glacier National Parks.

If Montana allows trophy hunting in iconic Wilderness areas in Montana, like the Bob Marshall, Great Bear, Scapegoat, Lee Metcalf, Absaroka-Beartooth, and Cabinet Mountains, Wilderness would no longer be safe havens for this magnificent bear. These bears are a keystone species that have helped to shape the ecosystems where they live. What I want to know is this, if we have so many grizzlies in the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem that it may be de-listed, why aren't we moving excess bears to other recovery zones? Or, why haven't we worked out a buffered corridor between the GYE and other recovery zones to the northwest that would allow them to migrate out of the area? Of course, trying to create a corridor now with human-created urban sprawl, could be downright impossible, but still. In my view, permitting trophy hunters to shoot grizzly bears, including deep within Wilderness areas, runs contrary to increasing grizzly bear numbers and allowing the Grizzly Bear to fully recover and reoccupy habitat critical for their continued survival. I have been informed that the state of Montana is considering allowing trophy hunting of grizzlies once they are de-listed from the ESA. I am writing to ask you not to allow this.

In my view, the only reason to control animal populations through killing them is when science shows that not doing so would be detrimental to ecosystems. An example would be deer, where their numbers are so high (typically through lack of predation) that they are reducing ecosystem diversity due to over-browsing.

While I do not object to controlling animal populations by lethal means consistent with the above, I do object to executing this by untrained, or poorly trained, volunteers ie 'Sportsmen'. Such control should be done by trained personnel who can identify and eliminate individual animals by age and gender to minimize the number required to achieve the population reduction goal. Allowing 'Sportsmen' to do this risks overkill, accidental or purposeful killing of non-target species, cruelty through poor marksmanship. To the Montana Grizzly Bear Advisory Council:

We are Ravalli County residents who are writing to support your work to minimize human-grizzly bear conflicts as their population increases. We look forward to a time when this keystone species has expanded into more of its historic range, but this expansion will inevitably be accompanied by increased human-bear interaction. Since Montana has enough excellent habitat to support significantly more bears and the existing population is still very low, we think that it is premature to remove them from the protection of the Endangered Species Act. Any such decision should be based on the judgement of independent scientists, who feel that there are adequate numbers to ensure, not just species survival in the area, but also a genetically diverse population. We also feel that the grizzly bear levels are too low to sustain hunting pressure, if the bears were to be delisted. Instead of delisting bears, or permitting them to be hunted, the State should focus on improving connectivity between populations of bears and between areas with bears and suitable habitat that does not yet have resident grizzlies. Connectivity is crucial to establish and maintain a healthy, genetically diverse population.

In order to minimize human-large predator conflicts, the State should be planning and implementing measures, such as subsidizing the installation of electric fencing around domestic animals, farm fields, and gardens, plus requiring and subsidizing bearresistant trash disposal containers in potential conflict areas. These would have the added benefit of reducing conflicts with other large predators, such as wolves, mountain lions, and black bears. We would be willing to pay increased state taxes in order to pay for these measures. Also, charismatic large animals are a significant draw for tourism, which is a burgeoning industry in Montana.

The grizzly bear population still only stands at a maximum of 1,500 individuals; found within just 2-3% of their historic range; despite their protection under the Endangered Species Act (ESA) and decades of conversation work since 1975. This is still a tiny number - although a vast improvement on the shamefully low 350-400 individuals the grizzly bears were reduced to.

And now this partial recovery is set to be undermined by trophy hunting.

The cause of death of these slow breeding animals (females stop reproducing in their mid to late 20s and half of the 10 cub-average produced during their lifetimes are likely to die in adolescence) is dominated by their deliberate killing via illegal poaching and legal lethal deterrents, the removal (aka destruction) of 'problem' bears and hunters putting themselves in perilous situations resulting in lethal self-defense. Add to this deaths by rail and road and the impact on bear populations will soon result in a negative growth rate.

51 bears were killed in 2018 and another 51 bears lost their lives again in 2019 - a 6.8% population loss in only 2 years! These deaths also severely reducing the genetic pool by limiting interactions between populations within the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem and the Glacier region; further impacting future breeding rates and health.

It is clear that the protection of grizzlies under the Endangered Species Act (ESA) needs to remain in place. For the state of Montana to preempt the removal of this protection and put in place plans to allow trophy hunting on public lands; including wilderness and wild buffer zones around Yellowstone and Glacier National Parks; is a complete dereliction of duty and betrayal of this long fought for grizzly bear recovery.

Their recovery is tenuous at best. To remove the current protection offered by the wilderness areas of Bob Marshall, Great Bear, Scapegoat, Lee Metcalf, Absaroka-Beartooth, and Cabinet Mountains is counter-intuitive to their survival and the very concept of wilderness.

As a keystone species, grizzly bears are essential to the wider ecosystem. The 98% of land that no longer benefits from their services is unquestionably poorer without their presence. To pen them into a fraction of the viable habitat in which they should exist is unnatural.

Trophy hunting is the epitome of disdain for any species - a day of egotism, plastered over social media. Why do hunters want to bag a grizzly bear? Because they are endangered!

Rather than promote trophy hunting the state should be further supporting the recovery of grizzly bears and the work of the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes of Montana by building underpasses and overpasses - especially on railroads - to reduce vehicular deaths of bears and many other species.

Governor's Grizzly Bear Advisory Council Public Comments

In life and in business, you are either part of the problem or part of the solution. I sincerely hope the Montana Grizzly Bear Advisory Council will choose to be a significant part of the solution rather than a major part of the problem.

Thanks to decades of advocacy by caring individuals like me, grizzly bears in the lower-48 states are currently protected under the Endangered Species Act (ESA), making it illegal to harm, harass, or kill these bears, except in cases of self-defense.

Unfortunately, the state of Montana is currently considering a plan to authorize trophy hunting of grizzly bears as soon as ESA protections are removed. I am speaking up for grizzlies by letting the Montana Grizzly Bear Advisory Council know that I strongly oppose trophy hunting.

A lawsuit against the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) in 2017, when the agency illegally tried to strip ESA protections from grizzly bears living in the Greater Yellowstone region, was successful. At that time, the suit also successfully blocked planned grizzly bear trophy hunts in Idaho and Wyoming.

We've stopped grizzly bear trophy hunting before, and now I ask the Montana Grizzly Bear Advisory Council to protect the Grizzly once again!

Thank you for the opportunity to submit comments. I strongly oppose trophy hunting of grizzly bears in Montana. While the grizzly bear is slowly recovering after near-extermination, these majestic species remain absent from nearly 98 percent of their historic range.

I and many others who love these bears have worked so hard for four decades to bring the grizzly bear back from the brink of extinction, so the idea that Montana would authorize trophy hunting is discouraging and distressing. Trophy hunting is unethical and a vestige from a bygone era. It is particularly inappropriate for this iconic grizzly bear that is still imperiled and has a very slow reproduction rate.

Grizzlies face continuing threats from climate change, dwindling key food resources, illegal poaching, lack of connectivity among populations, and the negative impacts from roads and railroad tracks fragmenting their habitat. In fact, the past two years saw record rates of grizzly bear mortality in Montana. Trophy hunting of grizzly bears in Montana will only lead to a further decline of an already fragile population and would make a connected metapopulation-essential for recovery of the species-a near impossibility.

There is no evidence that trophy hunting is effective at managing grizzly bear populations. Studies show that trophy hunting does not reduce human-bear or livestock-bear conflict. Research also shows that trophy hunting does not increase social acceptance, but may have the opposite impact.

The Council should take into consideration the perspectives of Tribal Nations, many of which consider the grizzly sacred.

If grizzly bears are delisted, at the very least, Montana must wait to see how they do without the Endangered Species Act's protections before allowing trophy hunting. It's just too soon to consider hunting. In 2017, Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks (FWP) recognized that a hunt should not be proposed immediately after delisting.

The #1 animal that tourists, who contribute about \$1 billion annually to the economy of the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem, hope to see in Montana is a grizzly bear. Bears are not only revered by many, but they are also very valuable to our nature-based economy.

Montana FWP and the Fish and Wildlife Commission must update the inaccurate and outdated Grizzly Bear Policy, which mistakenly states trophy hunting is an effective tool to prevent human-bear and livestock-bear conflict. Montana FWP should also put its energy and resources into assisting communities and recreationalists to prevent bear-human and bear-livestock conflict.

Again, I strongly oppose trophy hunting of grizzly bears in Montana. Please choose to be part of the solution rather than a force for the extinction of this remarkable species, a major tourist draw for Montana's economy.

Every one of you should be speaking out to defend and protect Grizzly Bears that have no voice and are such a unique species that are found in very few states. I can assure you that killing Grizzly Bears by and for trophy hunters would never occur in the North Cascades of Washington.
